# President's Perspective

The first weekend in October is always reserved for our annual Open House at the Boys Ranch. It is a time of celebration with horse shows, competitive events, presentations and special recognitions. At these events, we normally have thousands of guests and returning alumni. Our returning alumni, if my math is correct, represent over 6 decades of serving children. Many are now grandparents and a few are great-grandparents. Some are currently serving in the military, law-enforcement and corrections or working in private business.

While at the alumni meeting that Saturday morning, I overheard one former Rancher remark to another that it was good to be back home. This, of course, got my attention, so I kind of, sort of, eavesdropped for a few minutes on their conversation.

What is "home" I have asked myself lately? In fact, I have not only asked myself that question but others as well. I hear comments like our former Rancher made all the time and I even make the same remarks myself. For instance after a long trip telling my wife, "I am so happy to be home", or while working out of town saying to a colleague, "I am looking forward to going home." This is a common sentiment, widely used and said by almost everyone; it is even used in commercials trying to sell products since it is a phrase that stirs emotions.

ask each other questions, like “What are you doing these days? Oh yeah? When did you get married? How old is your son or daughter?” I heard telephone numbers being exchanged, addresses given out and comments like “We have got to get together.” I heard pride, excitement, sadness and laughter in their voices as they caught up on the past and present.

What I really heard was a family getting back together, because everything said was no different from what I hear when our extended family gathers together at different times for events.

So what is “home?” I have heard many different answers—it is a place where you feel safe, secure and loved; it is a place of memories, family and friends, a community where you attended school and church and it is a place where you felt as if you belonged. What I did not hear was that home is a structure or a building.

Back in 1997, my wife April and I had the opportunity to build a log house on the side of a mountain in North Carolina. It was a great opportunity, in fact too good to pass up. It will be our retirement home one day, but now we use it often as a getaway and a place we host reunions with family and friends. Each time I go to our cabin, the first thing I do is walk around and look at everything inside. I actually go in every room and look around, not checking for damages, bugs, mice or anything else, just remembering.

You see, my wife and I, along with her father, uncle, mother and some friends completed most of the interior work ourselves. As I walk around, I am remembering the events, the education I received from my father-in-law in the use of power tools, learning to do trim work, laying floors, hanging doors and more. I smile as I remember sleeping on the floor under heavy blankets, with snow blowing outside; sitting by the fireplace eating chips and cheese; and using a porta-potty that sat 25 yards from the house on cold winter days. I remember our daughter Amanda and her friend Casey running and sliding

across the hardwood floors, laughing all the way. As I roam through the house I also see my own childhood in much of the furniture that was handed down to us from my mother; my grandfather’s rocking chair, my father’s bookcase filled with his books, they all remind me of growing up in a family. The fact that I love going “home” to our cabin is not about the structure, but has everything to do with the memories of the past and the possibilities of the future.

For the past 58 years our children have called the Youth Ranches “home”. It is a place of memories, a place where they have felt safe, secure and loved. It is a place where they, like our family, are always welcomed back. It has been a place where parents and grandparents have brought their own families to visit, to catch up and to share their memories of growing up in one of our residential communities. It is also a place that has been kept going because of the generosity of others!

The holiday season is fast approaching; these are times when families get together to reconnect and new memories are created. It is also a time of celebrations here at the Youth Ranches. For many of our children it will be a first-time experience to enjoy a Thanksgiving Dinner, a Christmas Eve Service and a Christmas Morning in a family setting with a decorated tree and gifts in shiny packages underneath. It will be a time when new and beautiful memories are created, memories that will last them a lifetime. There is, after all, no place better than “home!”

Thank you for your continued support and generosity in providing so many boys and girls a place to call “home.”



# Family Legacies Come in Many Forms

Visiting with different donors, we get ideas about how they want their family to be remembered. Some chose to leave all their money and property directly to their family, hoping they will continue to support favorite charities. Others have made specific plans to ensure their charitable wishes are followed.

Here are a few of the more creative ideas we have seen in recent years:

- Naming the Florida Sheriffs Youth Ranches as a beneficiary of a life insurance policy, retirement account or bank account
- Specifying a particular percentage of your estate for the Florida Sheriffs Youth Ranches OR the opposite, specifying a particular percentage or piece of property for your heirs and leaving the remainder of your estate to the Youth Ranches
- Investing in a charitable gift annuity where the remainder after death goes to the Youth Ranches
- Making a cash gift of \$1,000 or more to the Youth Ranches in honor of a family member and request they be made a Lifetime Honorary Member of the Florida Sheriffs Association
- Contributing a minimum of \$10,000 and creating a family named endowment fund at the Ranch



- Establishing a Charitable Remainder Trust where distributions (set amount or %) are made to family members for a period of years and once complete, the balance is donated to the Youth Ranches
- Establishing a Charitable Lead Trust where a distribution (% or set amount) is made to the Youth Ranches for a period of 10 or 20 years, then the balance is distributed to your heirs when they are older and better prepared to receive these funds

These are just a few options to consider. As always, we encourage you to discuss this with your personal attorney or advisors to chart the best course for your future and remember to update your will annually as things and people in your life change!




