FLORIDA SHERIFFS YOUTH RANCHES, INC. DISCIPLINE POLICY

HANDOUT TO YOUTH AND FAMILY

The purpose of discipline is to teach youth life-skills necessary to grow into lawful, resilient, and productive citizens. The goal of any behavioral intervention should be for youth to learn to self-regulate, use positive coping skills, and develop positive pro-social behavior, rather than to punish or shame youth for poor choices. Our staff use holistic, evidenced-based, and trauma-informed strategies and interventions called Trust-Based Relational Intervention (TBRI®) to achieve long lasting behavioral change.

This handout is provided to help familiarize you with the guidelines governing our discipline process at the Florida Sheriffs Youth Ranches.

Proactive Strategies

Staff will first strive to prevent misbehavior by using proactive strategies such as mindfulness, pre-teaching, and focusing on each youth's individual strengths, interests, talents, and resources to provide opportunities for positive development.

Behavioral Interventions

At all times, staff will strive to be flexible and ensure each youth's basic physiological and emotional needs are met. When addressing misbehavior, staff will consider a continuum of the following interventions, starting with the least restrictive as seen below.

The TBRI IDEAL Response

In all cases, staff will use the TBRI IDEAL response to address misbehavior. The response will be:

- **Immediate:** Staff will aim to respond within 3 seconds
- **Direct:** Staff will use TBRI Engagement strategies including direct eye contact, proximity, and reassuring touch when appropriate
- **Efficient:** Staff will use the minimum amount of intervention necessary to get behavior back on track
- **Action-Based:** Staff will provide opportunities for youth to make the right choice. For example, when possible, offering the opportunity for a re-do
- Leveled at the Behavior, Not the Youth: Staff will address the behavior at hand and not the youth

Most Restrictive

Physical Restraint

The use of physical restraint may only be initiated and utilized by staff trained in the Crisis Prevention Institute's Non-Violent Physical Crisis Intervention techniques.

Physical restraint will only be used if the youth's behavior meets the following conditions:

- The youth's behavior presents a clear risk to themselves or others
- The youth's behavior is beyond instructional control
- Less restrictive alternatives and de-escalation strategies have proven unsuccessful

Any use of physical restraint will be documented in an incident report, follow-up with the youth will be completed using a Therapeutic Physical Intervention form, and you will be notified within 24 hours.

Family Review Conference

If the therapeutic discipline procedure has been thoroughly followed and positive change is not achieved, a Family Review Conference (FRC) may be needed to determine appropriateness of placement. The FRC will consist of a meeting including the youth, their family, and members of the treatment team to identify the youth's strengths and resources, current needs, goals, interventions and progress.

PROHIBITED FORMS OF DISCIPLINE

The following forms of discipline are prohibited in this agency:

- Any type of discipline that is emotionally degrading
- Harassment or bullying of children by staff or other youth based on their race, national origin, religion, gender, gender expression, sexual orientation, disability, or any other legally protected characteristic



- Any attempt to change, punish or discourage a youth's sexual orientation, gender identity, or gender expression
- Any use of corporal punishment
- Using youth to discipline other youth
- The use of forced physical exercise solely for the purpose of eliminating behavior
- Punitive work assignments
- The punishment of a group for one youth's behavior
- The use of medication as punishment, or as a restraint alternative
- Any use of mechanical restraints
- Extended isolation of a youth beyond the boundaries of what would be considered reasonable
- Threatening a youth's removal from a facility
- The use of any painful or aversive consequence
- Denial of food. This includes snacks though the staff may use discretion in snack selection
- Depriving the youth of their rights as defined in this agency's Youth and Family Rights guidelines

NON-PUNITIVE WORK GUIDELINES

The use of constructive work assignments as a means of encouraging appropriate behavior is permitted, but must be applied under the following conditions:

- Work must not be assigned in hourly increments, but as a teaching interaction, which is directly participated in and supervised by the staff member making the assignment
- The assigned work must have a beneficial use, and cannot be designed to be demeaning, degrading, or humiliating
- Whenever possible, the assigned work should have a logical connection to the behavior that is being addressed
- Any plan to assign work as a consequence must be done in consultation with the team or unit director

Drop Off/Pick Up

We will have a monitor outside to help with the flow of traffic. Morning Drop off will begin at 7:50 a.m. Please wait for your students to enter school before you leave. We will also try to use this time to address any type of dress code violation.

Visitors

All visitors will check in at the Boys Ranch Administration Building before coming to the school. The receptionist will call the Assistant to the Dean or Assistant to the Director of Education to let them know to expect visitors. It is recommended to call the school and schedule an appointment before arrival.

Summer School Program

All students in residence at the Boys Ranch will attend a mandatory summer Social Skills/Life Skills Course beginning onJune 1, 2026, and ending onJuly 9, 2026. Our Life Skills Course/Social Skills course will be from 8:00 a.m. until 9:00 a.m. Monday - Thursday. ALL students needing credit make-up or wanting to take a course will stay from 9:00 a.m. until 12:00 p.m. to complete the necessary coursework.

Trust Based Relational Intervention (TBRI®)

Here at the FSYR Donald Ralph Cooke School, we believe in providing students with the opportunity to learn in a trauma-informed environment where they can feel safe, cared for, and successful. Faculty and staff will implement Trust Based Relational Intervention (TBRI®) strategies to allow students to experience felt safety and connection and practice self-regulation. When misbehavior occurs, students may be given the opportunity for a redo, an offer of choices, or given an opportunity to ask for a compromise when appropriate before applying consequences.

First-Period Social Skills and Character Education

All students will participate in a first-period Social Skills and Character Education Course. This elective will focus on the principles of TBRI in a safe, fun, and nurturing environment while fostering relational health and building character within our students.

Cell Phones

Cell phones are prohibited in our school and on our campus. If a student is caught with their phone after 8:00, it will be taken from them by the dean and returned to their cottage parents/parent or unit director. If a student is caught with a cell phone for a 2nd time, the phone will be taken and not returned. An exception will be made for Senior Privileges. They will be expected to turn their cell phones into the front desk each morning. There will also be times when cell phones are needed by our Juniors and Seniors when signing up for testing and post-secondary preparation.

Academics

All students' transcripts are thoroughly evaluated upon acceptance into the Boys Ranch Program. All students will be placed into academic and elective courses based on their individual needs.

Students who need credit retrieval for failed coursework will either be placed in that course for the school year, attend after-school credit make-up, or be placed in summer school, depending on the time of year the student is accepted. Once a passing grade is achieved for semester work, the new score will be added to the transcript under the school year of completion. The failing grade will remain on the transcript but will not count against GPA.

Cheating and plagiarism are never allowed at FSYR Donald Ralph Cooke School. If a student is caught cheating or plagiarizing an assignment, they will receive a zero and the expectation will be that the student will repeat the assignment. This will be done during remediation days, monitored after school time, at home and/or in the study hall at their cottage. It will be up to the teacher to decide how their grades will be affected once the assignment is resubmitted.

Attendance

The importance of regular school attendance is emphasized by FSYR Donald Ralph Cooke School and by the Florida Compulsory Attendance Law. School attendance is the responsibility of the parent and the student.

Absences

It will be the responsibility of the student to make sure that all missed work is made up upon return to school. Students should obtain all make-up work within two days of returning to school. It will be at the teacher's discretion for the due date. If a student begins to fall behind in their academic courses, after-school tutoring and credit make-up will be assigned. For our resident parents, those who wish to request a non-scheduled home visit must do so at least two weeks prior to the dates you are requesting. The maximum amount of *excused* unscheduled home visit days shall not exceed 5 for the regular school year. Students should maintain a C or better average in all courses to be granted extended periods of time away from school. All requests will be handled on a case-by-case basis.

Students should not miss more than 10 days in a full school year or more than 5 per semester. Summer school may be assigned for those students who fall behind in their academics due to excessive absences.

A written excuse must be submitted to the Assistant to the Dean, Beth Warner or emailed to bwarner@youthranches.org for the student's absence/tardy to be excused.

Tardiness

It is the expectation that students will transition to and from class in a timely manner. A student will be considered tardy if they arrive to class after the tardy bell. Tardiness will be considered excessive when there are more than 2 per month.

Athletics

FSYR Donald Ralph Cooke School students will be allowed to participate in the Suwannee County School District sports programs and activities. Students must maintain a 2.0 minimum GPA per semester and have the approval of the educational team.

Students who need to leave early for practice, games, or any other extracurricular activities will be responsible for making up any work that is missed during this time. The amount of time a student must turn in their assignments will be determined by the individual teacher.

All students will be held to the same behavioral standards, and if after-school correction/reflection activities are assigned, they will be expected to attend. Students can be released to attend their activities as time allows.

Dress Code

All students will follow the dress and grooming policy and procedures set forth by the Florida Sheriffs Youth Ranches.

It is the expectation that ALL students will self-check for proper dress code each morning. We ask that all cottage parents and parents check students for proper dress code before they leave for school. Students out of dress code will be sent back home to

change immediately, which will result in unexcused tardies or absences from class. Another option would be for students to receive a Payment of Debt (POD) to purchase clothing in order to be in compliance if we have their sizes available. <u>Dress Code clothing can be purchased through French Toast Uniforms</u>.

Students will be allowed to wear sports jerseys, over dress code, on game days only.

Shirts Black, Heather Gray, True Royal, and Dark Green Polos. All polos must be solid in color with no symbols or embroidery other than the Cooke Colts logo.

Bottoms Khaki, Light Khaki, Gray, Navy, or Black cotton/twill slacks with or without pleats. Shorts must be of the same style. No holes, rips, or pattern marks. No superskinnies. No baggie or drop-waist pants. No cargo shorts. No pajama bottoms, elastic waistbands or drawstrings, or athletic pants/shorts are allowed except for in PE (see PE dress code). Pants must fit above the hips, and a belt is a daily requirement. The belt must be plain in color, black or brown (western belt buckles are allowed). The material must be twill or cotton, not denim.

Shoes No fashion athletic shoes (Air Force 1) or athletic shoes with laces are allowed at school except during PE. Shoes with laces must always be tied properly during PE. Acceptable shoes for school are slip-on Converse or Vans, deck shoes, dress shoes, cowboy boots, Hey Dudes, and slip-on athletic shoes (shoes with laces removed are not acceptable).

No fashion athletic shoes (Air Force 1) or athletic shoes with laces are allowed at school except during PE. Shoes with laces must always be tied properly during PE. Acceptable shoes for school are slip-on Converse or Vans, deck shoes, dress shoes, cowboy boots, Hey Dudes, and slip-on athletic shoes (shoes with laces removed are not acceptable).

Backpacks Backpacks are only permitted at school for the following: Students who leave directly from school for town jobs, on-campus OJT, dual enrollment, and sports practice. They may bring a backpack with a change of clothes for their activity. These items must be given to our Assistant to the Dean. These items are subject to be searched at any time.

<u>Jackets/Coats</u> One pullover quarter zip with school mascot will be issued to each student for a \$35 charge. Included in this handbook is the Adidas Jacket that is acceptable for dress code. No other coat, jacket, hoodie, or pullover will be allowed at Donald Ralph Cooke School. If a student is caught with inappropriate hoodies, jackets, or coats, they will be taken and not returned. There will be a cold weather exception to this rule that will be sent home once cold weather begins.

PE Clothing Boys and Girls All students are required to dress out for PE. Only basketball-style shorts are allowed. No spandex allowed. Shirts must be crew neck. Socks must be worn with athletic shoes. A PE bag will be provided. A small drawstring bag will be allowed to bring PE clothes daily.

Food

Snacks

In order to empower our students by meeting their physiological needs, FSYR Donald Ralph Cooke School will provide 2 healthy snacks per day at the beginning of the 3rd and 6th periods. Students are not allowed to bring snacks from the cafeteria or home. Any student found to be in possession of an inappropriate snack must turn in the inappropriate snack and choose a snack from those provided.

The school will provide a water bottle for each student to be brought to school and taken home each day. Students will be responsible for keeping up with their assigned bottle. If a replacement bottle is needed, students will be charged a POD (Payment of Debt) of \$3 to replace their bottle. No other drinks will be allowed at school, and they will be confiscated and thrown away.

Harassment Policy

Sexual, ethnic, racial, or religious harassment of any specific employee or student will not be tolerated. Offenses refer to physical or verbal actions that have the purpose or effect of creating a hostile, offensive, or intimidating learning environment or have an ethnic, racial, religious, or sexual basis. Examples would include physical contact of a sexual nature and sexual, racial, ethnic, or religious comments or insults. All complaints and incidents will be investigated in a confidential manner. Where violations occur, immediate action will be taken to remedy the situation and prevent its reoccurrence.

SAFETY

The following are always prohibited from FSYR Donald Ralph Cooke School campus:

Sexual Activity
Drugs/Alcohol/Vapes
Gross Disrespect
Possession of Pornography and/or explicit music and jokes

FSYR Donald Ralph Cooke School has a safety plan in place in accordance with the policies and procedures of FSYR Boys Ranch. Consequences will be issued in the form of Out of School Behavior Reflection Days. Violations can lead to expulsion from program based on severity of the offense.

General Behavioral and Discipline Expectations

We will follow the COLTS Way for behavioral expectations at FSYR Donald Ralph Cooke School. The Florida Sheriffs Youth Ranches, Inc. Discipline Policy, and TBRI Principles

and Practice will be the foundation for behavioral management at FSYR Donald Ralph Cooke School. All families will receive a copy of the FSYR Discipline Policy.

- C- Be a Good CITIZEN
- O- OWN Your Behavior
- L- Be an Active **LISTENER**
- T- Be TRUSTWORTHY
- S- Maintain SELF-CONTROL

We will address behavioral issues using the TBRI Four Levels of Response. Utilizing Playful and Structured Engagement, students will be given opportunities to reset, redo, de-escalate, and regulate to correct their behavior. Calming and Protective engagement will be used when a student or situation becomes escalated. All discipline issues will be handled case-by-case, according to the student's needs.

Testing

We will utilize the Stanford 10 (2018) for standardized testing for grades 6-10. Our students in grades 11 and 12 will need to be signed up for ACT in the fall and/or in the spring.

Dual Enrollment

Students who need a Foreign Language credit, CTE credit, or a credit in a desired course we do not offer can sign up to take that course through FLVS.

Students wishing to enroll in technical courses to earn industry certifications may do so through River Oak Technical upon entering their 11th-grade year. Students must have a 2.0 or higher and be in good behavioral standing with our program.

Students may also dually enroll for college courses through North Florida Community. They offer both in-person and online courses. Students must have a 3.0 or higher, be in good behavioral standing with our program, and perform high enough on the P.E.R.T, SAT, or ACT.

Family Engagement

Twice per year we will have Family Engagement activities for Donald Ralph Cooke School. They will take place the Friday before Thanksgiving and Spring Break. Communication about each event will be mailed and emailed home.

We will also send home end of the year surveys each May. Your feedback about our school is greatly appreciated.

Library Policy

- 1. The Library will be open Monday through Friday for the last 15 minutes of each class period.
- 2. Students may check out only one book at a time.
- 3. Students must return the current book checked out prior to checking out a new book.
- 4. Lost or damaged books must be paid for before the student will be allowed to check out another book.




