# WHO WE ARE

When two Florida Sheriffs proposed an idea to establish a Ranch to help care for troubled boys in 1957, they never could have imagined the result of their simple dream. They saw a need in their communities to give wayward boys a safe place where they could learn to be productive citizens.

The original intention was simple: Give these boys a home where they could grow up safe and cared for while working through daily problems. The goal was to stop the spread of juvenile delinquency and keep children out of jail.

Over time, the Florida Sheriffs Boys Ranch continued to grow. Multiple campuses were opened throughout the state, serving boys, girls, and sibling groups. In 1981, a summer camp program started on the Boys Ranch campus in tents and grew into three residential summer camps and the award-winning Harmony in the Streets mobile camp program.

Today, after 68 years, the Florida Sheriffs Youth Ranches is a statewide network of residential campuses, youth camping programs and community-based services. Beginning with a mere \$5,000 and 160 acres of donated land along the Suwannee River, **the Florida Sheriffs Youth Ranches has now served over 190,000 boys, girls and their families.**

Every year, hundreds of children turn to the Youth Ranches for assistance. We look forward to helping each one of them meet their personal goals and become resilient, productive, and law-abiding citizens. With the support of generous donors, volunteers and staff, we will continue to fulfill this commitment of Mending Lives and Healing Hearts.

# KEY POINTS

The Florida Sheriffs Youth Ranches (FSYR) must be responsible to the donors who fund our charitable work with the children and families of Florida. We must earn your trust each and every day. Our credibility rests on a foundation of honesty, accountability, integrity and high-quality service to the children and families of Florida.

- FSYR has once again earned the highest audit rating, known as an unmodified opinion, from the external audit firm of Batts Morrison Wales & Lee, P.A.
- FSYR is in a strong financial position with *no* debt.
- FSYR was the first organization in the state to be issued a Charitable Gift Annuity permit in 1974, and we maintain reserves in this fund equal to, or exceeding, state standards.
- FSYR is very conservative in the management of expenses. No portion of our direct mail appeals, donor correspondence or publications is considered an “educational or program-related” expense.

Furthermore, we do not hire professional fundraising companies, *nor do we conduct any telephone solicitations.*









Chart reflects percentages of operational expenses.



# PROGRAMS AND SERVICES

## Residential Care

Our trained and devoted staff are well-equipped to nurture needy, neglected boys and girls and provide a warm sense of security, guidance and tenderness. Ranchers are cared for by a married couple who serve as cottage parents. Their purpose is to help each boy and girl develop a strong work ethic and a sense of responsibility, teamwork and respect.

## Referral Services

Serving the 67 counties of Florida, we work with the families of children in our care. Our Family Engagement Specialists are available to assist parents as necessary, offering support and referral services to the families of Florida.

## Camping Services

**Harmony in the Streets**<sup>®</sup> is a mobile camping program that brings the four “R’s” directly into local communities that may be socially and/or economically challenged. Our staff and Law Enforcement volunteers teach children to Respect Themselves, Respect Others, Respect Elders and Respect the Environment.

**Harmony in the Family** is a two-phase family engagement program created in partnership with the Department of Juvenile Justice, Charlotte County Sheriff’s Office, FSJR Board Chair and Charlotte County Sheriff Bill Prummell, and the Florida Sheriffs Association. The program’s primary goal is to strengthen family connections and help prevent juvenile delinquency by equipping families with tools to build a supportive and resilient home environment. Harmony in the Family is designed to serve underprivileged families who may benefit from guidance in understanding and healing family dynamics.

# PROGRAMS AND SERVICES

**Summer Resident Camp** includes many empowering camping activities. Canoeing, archery, swimming, arts and crafts and other activities allow deserving boys and girls the opportunity to build basic teamwork and peer communication skills. The youth also spend a week enjoying the beautiful and tranquil outdoor environment.

**Residential Leadership Programs** are hosted at camp and led in conjunction with community partners. This sometimes includes JROTC, ROTC and other leadership groups that work with us to guide young people through challenging activities to help them grow their leadership skills.

**Other Camping Services** consists of groups that utilize the residential summer camp facilities when summer camp is not being held. These groups can include corporate leadership retreats, church groups, and other community events that are not solely focused on serving youth. Offering these services helps us connect with our communities and share our mission to a wider audience.
